Chaplain's Message



Dear Brother Knights,

I would like to share with you some of my thoughts on the Samaritan Womanøs question to Jesus that, "How can you, a Jew, ask me, a Samaritan woman, for a drink?" This question is very significant in many ways.

***When the disciples returned from town, they were shocked to see Jesus speaking to a Samaritan woman. It was very shameful for a Jew to speak to a woman in public, that too, to a Samaritan woman. Note that a Hebrew husband could divorce his wife if she was found

familiarly talking with menø Jesus here over looks a tradition that insults women, a tradition that was imposed on by the so called religious leadersø Jesusø chatting with the woman uplifts the dignity of womanhood, in a male dominated culture. (Do some of us struggle to acknowledge the leadership of women in society?)

***There was animosity between the Jews and the Samaritans. Jesus acted above the racial bigotry. He purposefully travelled through Samaria. He asked His disciple to get food from the Samaritan town. Jesus himself asked a drink from a Samaritan woman. This incident should be an eye opener to those who are racially prejudiced. No child of God is an ÷outcastø Everyone has worth and value. (Are we not all the children of God?)

*** The Samaritan woman was a weary sinner. Jews always hesitated to associate with sinners. One of the main accusations against Jesus was that He was a friend of sinners. (Do we not keep off some of our brothers and sisters?)

As Brother Knights, how do we feel about this story? Can we rise above all kind of discriminations and defend the message of Christ?

The Samaritan woman is life was falling apart. Jesus net it together with a compassionate gesture. Through this Samaritan woman, the whole village came to believe in this istrange Jew Whereas the Jews rejected, these Samaritans accepted Jesus as their Messiah. A noble gesture can transform a person, a village or a Nation. You and I can net together someone broken life. Obstacles on your ways are God's gifts to you to help you to grow into Him.

Annuities: More Flexible Than You Might Think

However, annuitizing this money isnot your only option. You may also treat an annuity like a Guaranteed Investment Certificate (GIC). That is, you can use the annuity as a way to accumulate savings and earn a steady interest rate. You can make withdrawals from the annuity for any reason, although you may then owe income tax on some, or all, of the withdrawal

amount. And, if you do choose to annuitize, you also have several payout options.

The point is, these products are flexible enough to serve a variety of needs.




