to this presentation was Charity, Unity. and Fraternity. The importance of programs is to recruit and keep members. An active council is a successful council not only in recruiting, but in spreading the word of the good works we do. Another point they made is to tell the community and parish what we do. I mentioned to them that we are members of the chamber and they liked this idea for publicity. Another key to membership is retention, and to keep members active we need to include new and old members in the programs they enjoy doing. A story that was told, %here is a council that recruited a member, but he was not able to attend all meetings, but he's a carpenter and told them he'd be happy to help in making things. The church needed a cross to put the names of the new religious education students on it. When the Knights asked this new member to make it, he asked for no recognition, but asked for the council thanks. He can't make meetings but he's a valuable member+. Do we have any members that may have special talents that don't come to meetings or are not active but can help in their own way? We have 92 members that are not active, if you know of anyone in this status contact them and ask why they're not active. They may have talents that make them very valuable to the council and the community. To all members let's be proactive in keeping members by greeting new members and reaching out to old members. Last month I said we need to have 13 new members and 5 insurance members. We have 3 current new members and one will be voted on in October, so we need 9 more. If we suspend any members we need to double our recruiting efforts. Let's shoot for doubling our numbers to 26 new members, but not just numbers. Be selective in who you ask. Look for men that can be active even if they can only be active with their talents.




An Announcement by Brother Joe LaGuardia on the dinner/dance and the initiative by Supreme.

Announcing auditions

Our Lady Queen of Peace Knights of Columbus Council 11680 is sponsoring the presentation of the award winning stage drama TWELVE ANGRY MEN to be presented January 15 thru January 25, 2015.

Auditions will be held at the conclusion of the October 2 meeting, a Thursday.

PRIOR EXPERIENCE IN COMMUNITY THEATER ACTING IS NOT NECESSARY

There are 13 roles available, the twelve jurors who are on stage from beginning to end, and a very small role for the Court Bailiff. The off stage voice of the Judge will be played by Pasco County's distinguished Tax Collector, Brother Mike Fasano.

The objective is to cast the play from within the ranks of the Council membership. If that does not become possible, then Brother Maurice will reach to the parish community, but he is hopeful that will not be necessary.

If you are chosen, rehearsals will be held beginning November 17. Cast needs to rehearse a minimum of 3 days per week for 8 weeks.

The production will also need assistance with other responsibilities such as Box Office Manager, two ushers for each of the seven production days, and a Stage Manager whose duties can be performed by the same individual playing the Court Bailiff. Deputy Grand Knight Martin Michelson has accepted the responsibility to serve as Production Coordinator.

TWELVE ANGRY MEN

Notes on characters and costumes

Guard (Court Bailiff)- This is a bit part. Can be any age and the only one that wears a uniform.

Juror # 1 – The Jury Foreman, somewhat preoccupied with his duties; impressed with his authority; handles himself quite formally; proves to be accommodating to others. He is an assistant high school football coach.

Juror # 2 – A meek, hesitant and unpretentious bank clerk who is at first domineered by others but finds his voice as the discussion goes on.

Juror # 3 – A business owner, a distraught father; the antagonist; a strong, forceful and opinionated individual, stubborn with a temper. Intolerant of the opinion of others, with a streak of sadism; accustomed to forcing his views and opinions on others.

Juror #4 – A rational stockbroker. Unflappable, self-assured and analytical. Seems to be a man of wealth. Well groomed, well dressed, distinguished appearance. A practiced speaker who presents himself well at all times.. The only that wears glasses. Doesn't perspire.

Juror #5 – A young man from a violent slum, Works as a hospital orderly. Naïve. Takes his obligations very seriously but finds it difficult to speak up when his elders have the floor.

Juror # 6 – A House painter. Tough but principled and respectful.

Juror # 7 – A loud, flashy, glad-handed salesman who has more important things to do than to sit on a jury. A Yankee sports fan. Superficial and indifferent to the deliberations. Quick to show temper and equally quick to form opinions on things he knows nothing about.

Juror #8 – The protagonist. An architect by profession. He is a quiet, thoughtful, gentle man – who sees all sides of every question and constantly seeks the truth. A man of strength tempered with compassion. Above all, he is a man who wants justice to be done, and will fight to see that it is.

Juror # 9 – The oldest of the jurors but with a perfect 20/20 vision. Wise, observant gentle and lonely old man, long since defeated by life. A widower. Lives alone. If he has any children or grand-children, they either live far away or don't see him often or at all. He recognizes himself for what he is, and mourns the days when it would have been possible to be courageous without shielding himself behind his many years.

Juror # 10 – A garage owner, Pushy, loud mouth bigot. Angry, bitter – a man who antagonizes almost at sight. Places no value on any human life save his own. Has been nowhere and is going nowhere and knows it deep within him.

Juror # 11 – A watchmaker from eastern Europe. Probably a refugee. A naturalized American citizen. He speaks with an accent but has greater command of the English language than most other jurors. He is a humble man, very respectful of others, who will honestly seek justice because he has suffered through so much injustice

Juror # 12 – A wisecracking, indecisive advertising executive. Slick, bright, who thinks of human beings in terms of percentages, graphs and polls, and has no real understanding of people. A superficial snob, but trying to be a good fellow.
