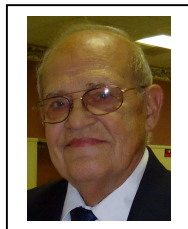

## Chaplain's Message

Dear Brother Knights,

“Master, I want to see”-  
a prayer that stopped God



The blind Bartimaeus' prayer, “Master, I want to see” is the sweetest of its kind. It was the sigh of a soul, a desperate cry from a blind beggar sitting by the wayside, hoping to march with the new King of Israel towards the ‘New Jerusalem’. He dearly wanted ‘sight’ to change the course of his life (and he did follow Jesus). He certainly knew ‘who Jesus is’ more than anybody else in the crowd. That was why the din of the crowd could not silence him at all. His healing was an awakening call to the crowd who failed to recognize Jesus of Nazareth who is ‘Son of David, the Messiah’. The blind Bartimaeus opened the eyes of the crowd; helped them to see the Messiah, who was among them and whom the whole world was waiting for.

We often don't have the patience to raise our voice above that of the crowd to be heard. We are often silenced by our situations. As a result we spend the entire life by the waysides, begging and blaming. The story of Bartimaeus tells us we can transform others, and ourselves if we choose to do so. Our voice has the power to change the world. No one can but ourselves silence us.

Where ever we live or whatever is our life situation, it should not wear us down. Convert any situation to be successful. Focus on the abilities and disregard the defects. Bartimaeus was only blind, he could hear. He heard and powerfully responded. His voice was his powerful weapon and he raised it to the highest note. The crowd, who asked him to shut up, stood still to listen him pray, “Master, I want to see.” If God stops for us, the world will wait for us.

**ANNUAL VETERANS DAY PARADE IN TAMPA**

All members are welcome to attend James A. Haley Veterans' Hospital's (JAHVH) 5<sup>th</sup> Annual Veterans' Day Parade. This year the parade route will exit Freedom Lot heading onto Livingston Avenue and enter our hospital campus from Richard Silver Way (back gate) and disband in the Diamond Lot of the main campus.

Please park in Liberty Lot (located between Livingston and SW corner of 132<sup>nd</sup> Avenue). You may also park at the new parking garage located on the main campus on Richard A. Silver Way and take the cross walk over to the Freedom Lot. Line-up begins in the Freedom Lot at 9:15 a.m. Freedom Lot entrance is located on the west side of Livingston street and NW corner of 132<sup>nd</sup> Avenue.

There will be water, port-o-lets and first aid available during line-up. Parade Marshalls will provide you with your firm parade line-up location when you arrive. Note there will be signage indicating your location in the line-up. This is necessary because as occasional volunteers, you are protected by the Federal Tort Claims Act while participating in our Veterans Day Parade.

The parade will exit the south entrance of the Freedom Parking Lot at approximately 10:00 a.m. The parade route is approximately one mile. **There is a change in the program this year; the parade will follow the ceremony.** There will be a cookout in Diamond Parking Lot following the parade. Food and beverages are free to all. We look forward to seeing you on **Monday, November 12<sup>th</sup>** for this special occasion honoring our veterans.
